What to pack:

- IDs (driver's license and passport)
- Copies of IDs for backup
- Airline ticket/confirmation information
- Medications and vaccination card
- Electronics (phone, laptop, chargers, adapters, portable charger, earphones, etc.)
- Umbrella
- 3–5 Pairs of pants
- 6–8 Shirts
- 1–2 Nice church outfit
- 1 Swimsuit (females=one-piece/males=modest trunks)
- Pajamas
- Undergarments, socks, etc.
- Light jacket and/or sweater
- Toiletries
- 1–2 Pairs of comfortable walking shoes
- Comfortable dress shoes

When planning your wardrobe, consider the weather, clothing care requirements, and the limited luggage space available. Choose clothing that is neat, comfortable, easy to care for, appropriate in your host country, and which meets BYU dress standards. Most importantly, take as little as possible! You will need to carry your own luggage at airports and on field trips.

Do Not Pack
